



## Mr. Bernard P. "Bernie" Lyons

July 17, 1922 - April 30, 2018

Bernard P. "Bernie" Lyons passed away Monday, April 30, 2018, after a brief battle with lung cancer. He was born to Henry and Helen (Burg) Lyons on July 17, 1922,

in Chelsea, Michigan. He attended St. Mary's Parochial School through eighth grade

and Chelsea High School. He graduated in 1939.

Bernie attended the University of Michigan from 1940-1943. He was the first of

his family to attend college. The tuition for his first semester was \$55--a lot of money in

1940. He worked and saved to earn money for college.

Bernie served in the Army from 1943-1945. He was a cryptographer with the 457th bomb group in Glatton, England, about 60 miles north of London. Three of

Bernie's four brothers also served in World War II, one in the Air Force, one in the Army,

and one in the Navy.

After the war ended Bernie returned home. He married Anita McClear on November 24, 1945, in Chelsea. Anita worked as a bookkeeper while Bernie attended

the University of Michigan under the GI Bill. He graduated in 1947 with a Bachelor of

Arts degree in journalism. He went to work as a reporter with the Port Huron Times Herald. Bernie worked at The Times Herald from 1947 until his retirement in 1992, except for five years as editor of the Lafayette (Indiana) Journal and Courier from 1973-1978. He was active in professional organizations throughout his career. He retired when work got in the way of his golf game.

Bernie was preceded in death by his wife Anita, his son William "Bill" Lyons, his very special friend Carolyn Barker, and all six siblings: Joseph Lyons, Richard Lyons, Maurice Lyons, Thomas Lyons, Therese Doll, and Rosemary Lutovsky. He is survived by daughters Dawn Lyons (Den Ciul) of Toronto and Jill Lyons (Jeff Kendrick) of Fort Gratiot; grandchildren Colleen (Chris) Shibley, Shay (Jim) Considine, Caitlin (David) Hessler, Brendan (Victoria) Lyons, Austin Kendrick, Jillian Kendrick, Cassandra Kendrick (Michael Amin), Alicia Kendrick, Belinda Sampson, and Michael Ciul; brothers-in-law Don Doll, Ray Lutovsky, and Don (Betsy) McClear; very special friends Rob (Colleen) Barker, Pat (Jim) Mielke, Cheryl Frank, Laura Frank, and Kathy Schneider; great-grandchildren, Christopher, Nicholas, Erika, Collin, Bryan, Christopher, Dallas, Makayla, Robert, Katie, Paul, Amato, Melody, Magic, Billy, Willy, Roy, Culamaya, Dorothy, and Rose; also many nieces, nephews, and friends.

Bernie was an active member of St. Edward's Catholic Church in Lakeport. He was previously a member of St. Lawrence in Lafayette (Indiana), St. Joseph in Port

Huron, St. Mary's in St. Clair, and a founding member of St. Mary's in Port Huron.

Bernie was involved with Community Foundation of St. Clair County. He was previously

involved with Mercy Hospital, Port Huron Museum, International Symphony Orchestra

and many other community organizations.

Bernie played poker on Mondays, went to lunch on Wednesdays, and played golf

on Thursdays. He was in supper club and dance club; attended concerts and plays;

supported University of Michigan sports teams; worked crossword puzzles; read books

and newspapers; and watched TV news.

There will be a memorial Mass at St. Edward's at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, May 15.

There will be a Celebration of Life luncheon in St. Edward's Parish Hall following the Mass.
