“ *Why I love my mom. My mom was born in 1925 in Wales and then moved to Southampton and soon after moving to Southampton WW2 began. Mom talks about poverty and not having batteries for her bike light so that she could ride to work. She talks about the air raids and how the kids would be tired of leaving the house to go to the air raid shelters at night and how they would take their shoes off and bang them on the floor so Grandpa would think they were leaving to go to the air raid shelter. Mom said they complained it was late and we have to get up and go to work in the morning. Mom talks about having one egg for seven children and how hard life was and they had no chocolate, no sugar, barely enough to eat until the Americans came to fight the war it was only then they were able to have butter...as the soldiers would bring butter and chocolate to the community.*

Mom got married in September 1945 in Southampton at the end of WW2. In April 1946 mom boarded the USS Washington to come to New York Harbor, New York, to be with her new husband, Pete. Being with daddy brought new challenges and opportunities for mom. My grandfather and my dad met her at the harbor the she headed to Shelton, CT.

In Shelton her in-laws did not speak a lot of English. She was grateful as the years passed that her sisters-in-law were attentive and able to speak English and took her under their wing to acclimate her to a new society.

During her early year's mom lost three children. And finally, in 1952 they decided to adopt a child ... me. I look back at the heartache that my mother went through and I marvel at how much she has endured over her lifetime from poverty the loss of children and then being blessed have my bother Patrick and I. Crossing the ocean in its self would have been challenging and then never knowing when she would see her mother again....and what her new life would bring!!! That's a lot to take in for 22-year-old woman...and that is my I love my mom so much. She has taught me to be strong and to have faith She will always have a special place in my heart.
