I love you Dave and will miss you forever but you are forever in my heart.

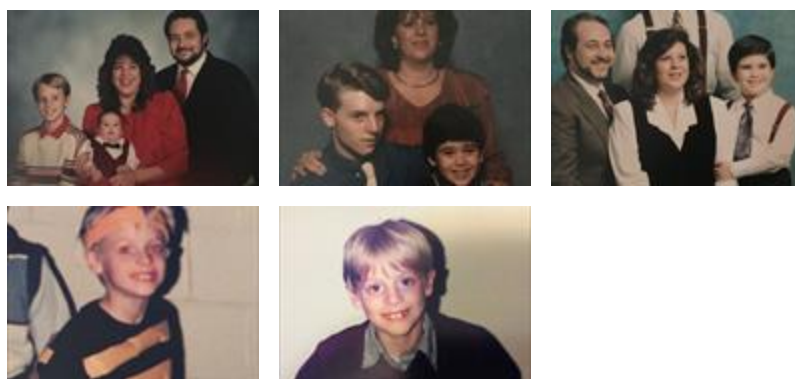

And now we say goodbye.*

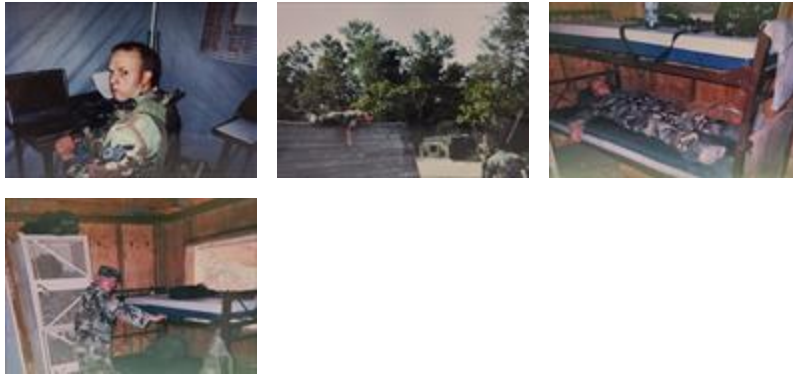
