George E. Hill, 81, of Avoca passed away on January 7, 2024, at Henry Ford Hospital, Detroit.

He was diagnosed with cancer in March 2023 and bravely battled the disease. He was born May 16, 1942, at the family home in Avoca, the son of the late Clifton and Ordeen

(Kook) Hill. George was a Yale graduate of 1960. Charlotte Myers of Marysville agreed to marry George on September 12, 1964 in Fargo, Michigan.

George commuted to Ford Motor Company Axle Division in Sterling Heights for 32 years and was also co-owner of Char's Silk Flowers located in Marysville. After retirement, George and Char loved touring the Thumb area as well as visits to see their daughters and grandchildren as far as New Mexico, Texas, Illinois, and Georgia. For over 10 years, his daily routine was to check the mail at the Avoca Post Office, make his deliveries, and loved taking rides to the Edison Power Plant to check deer, wildlife and just stopping off to chat with his family, childhood friends and neighbors. Often found at "The Shop" or K's, the "Tool Man" was known to have just what someone needed and the advice to fix a problem.

George is survived by his two daughters; Brenda (Anthony McKinney) Hill and Tracey (Jim) Muldoon, also of Avoca, two grandchildren; Lexie Muldoon and
