Many times, in visiting George we would go with the intention of uplifting George's spirits. More often than not, George would be the one to uplift our spirits. George was not afraid to share personal feelings regarding the Parkinson's that was affecting his later years in his life. George would not feel sorry for himself, however he did express the frustration that Parkinson's was causing to his memory and his ability to remain independent. George also shared and treasured the memories of family and friends and the relationships that over the years became more distant and not as close as they had been. George was always looking to find and remember the best in people.

Joanna & I will always cherish and remember the sense of humor, the jokes George could originate, even if the situation was not going well, his smile and maybe mostly, his sense of optimism in finding the best in people and in life's situations. We think heaven is a better place with George's presence and feel the loss of Georges presence especially for his beloved wife and best friend, Ann. Heaven's gain is our loss; however, we will work to maintain the sense of humanity and goodwill that George brought to this world.
