



Glenn G. Groner

April 5, 1931 - November 12, 2022

Glenn Gordon Groner, age 91, of Lexington passed away on November 12, 2022, with family by his side. Throughout his adult life, he survived armed combat in the Korean War as well as multiple major surgeries later in life.

He was born on April 5, 1931 to the late Lucille and Floyd Groner in Pierson, Michigan. Growing up in Howard City, Michigan, he enjoyed outdoor activities and became an avid hunter and fisherman. After graduating from Howard City High School in 1949, he enlisted in the Marine Corps and fought in the Korean War, where he sustained significant hearing loss, which impacted his life daily. Upon returning to the United States, Glenn served his remaining military years at the Navel Mine Depot as Commander of the Guard until his honorable discharge in 1954. He then went on to study Zoology at Michigan State.

After graduation, he landed his first teaching job as a Chemistry and Physics teacher in St. John's, Michigan, kicking off a 33-year career in education, serving in various roles as a teacher, coach, and administrator.

While serving as an educator, he met Lynne Ellen Fransen, and they wed in 1966. Throughout his 56-year marriage to Lynne, he became the proud and loving father of their three children, Laurel, Susan, and Peter.

After retiring, Glenn spent his time officiating sporting events, hunting, and

fishing, but most enjoyed spending time with his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren, who were the light of his life.

He is survived by wife, Lynne Groner, his three children; Laurel (Isaac) Groner, Susan (Michael) Regg and Peter Groner; his four grandchildren; Eric (Tristane), Courtney (Dan), Adam and Logan as well as his five great-grandchildren; James, Cole, Callahan, Mia, and Tate.

Services will take place at Great Lakes National Cemetery, date to be announced.
