“ John, (JP), was my cousin. I remember him best from our childhood. I was born in 1946 so there were several years between us as children. As children, our paths crossed mostly at the farm on Bryce Road. I lived south, some 40 or 50 miles away, near Detroit, so the farm was the main family gathering place. My Aunt Wanda, was one of the Cymbalski family's 10 brothers and sisters. When the family was "decades" younger, the farm was the center of life. There was a barn, farm animals, hand operated water pump, and radio on the farm plus electric lights and kerosene heat. Later, a black and white TV and cold running water came to the farmhouse. The family came together for visits and for family reunions. Plenty of food, drinks, and play for all ages. There were no electronic distractions back in those days. I don't even remember a dial telephone at the farm. We played egg toss and other games outside. Then the "passage" of time came along. School, jobs, marriages, moving, obligations, distractions, failing health, death, were all found to be part of life too. The ties to the greater family thinned out as the one generation grew into another generation. Mothers who were the essential glue between family members, aged and passed. On one visit from out of state, my wife Marsha and I had occasion to visit with John, Melanie, and my Aunt Wanda. This was a difficult time as my Aunt Wanda's health had failed. She was now in the care of John and Melanie. I remember both John and Melanie, for how well they accepted this responsibility, handling it with love and grace. Rest my cousin.
