“ Larry was one of 6 children. We were a very close family - especially as we grew up. There are too many memories to list - I'll try to list some here. I can see his impish smile - and for some reason since hearing of his passing, I especially remember him ice skating and just smiling away as he did so. We often played games at night - there were enough of us to do so. He was the one who usually won at Monopoly! He always made sure he bought Park Place and Boardwalk and add hotels, etc. so that we'd be doomed. He served honorably in the Navy on a nuclear weapons ship. He served as an altar boy while attending Holy Redeemer grade school - this could mean serving at 5:30am mass. He would at times get in some scraps at school - I'd see a crowd and sure enough it was Larry and another - I would break it up being his older sister! Nothing serious just being a regular boy but I'd give him heck all the way home. He was in the first graduation class at Churchill High School in Livonia. As a young adult, he got into cars. He had a gorgeous 1965 red GTO and Joe remembers helping him put in a new clutch in his 1963 Ford Galaxy convertible - 390 4 speed. His work as an adult was that of a Jig Grinder which required very exact work and he was able to do it - he was a very intelligent man.
