February 12, 1951 - December 15, 2024

Linda K. Stewart Rewalt age 73 of Macomb, Michigan, formerly of Grosse Pointe Woods, Michigan, passed away on Sunday, December 15, 2024, after a short but fierce battle with pancreatic cancer. Linda was born February 12, 1951 in Detroit to the late Dr Maitland N. Stewart Jr. MD, and the late June (Frank) Stewart. Linda graduated from Grosse Pointe High School in 1969 and went on to graduate from secretarial school in addition to attending Macomb Community College. She married Thomas Rewalt in Saint Clair, Michigan on July 1, 1995.

She began her career at Michigan Consolidated Gas Company and continued to work in DTE's natural gas businesses until she retired from DTE as an analyst after "46 and a half years" of service.

In addition to her family and friends, Linda loved babies and animals. She was proud of her participation in many of DTE's volunteer programs, especially those that help feed the hungry. She spent time visiting and shopping with her closest friends, following her classmates on Facebook and enjoying her relationship with all her Richmond girlfriends.

She is survived by her husband of almost 30 years, Tom; her children; Erich Binder and Kay Binder, Stepchildren; Patrick Larsen and Christopher Rewalt (Meghan McInnis), Grandchildren; Tiana McClendon, Parker Larsen, Bella

“ I am very sorry to see that Linda passed away. We often worked together on things when she was at the Romeo compressor station. Always a great friend, I can attest to her passion for helping feed the poor. She was integral to growing food on some unused acreage just north of the station proper. That summer we harvested over 1,100 pounds of tomatoes and countless summer squash. When fall harvest time came, we took in over 10,000 pounds of butternut squash that was planted in the spring. It was picked up by Gleaners for the Detroit based food bank. I still remember the photo of Linda and several other volunteers, including one VP, hanging on the wall of the office out there. They had all come out to help harvest squash. There was so much it took two days to pick it all up.. I hope that pic still hangs there!

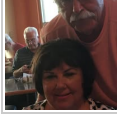
