



Lucy A. Suchecki

May 3, 1945 - August 30, 2022

Lucy Ann Suchecki, 77, a beloved daughter, sister, aunt, cousin & Godmother and a forty five year resident of Clay Township, MI, died of liver cancer on Tuesday, August 30, 2022 at Troy Beaumont Hospital. Lucy was born May 3, 1945, in Cleveland, OH. The wife of the late Robert K. Suchecki, United States Army Vietnam era veteran and daughter of the late Adelaide (Maneri) Urban and Benjamin Urban.

Lucy a dedicated L'Anse Creuse teacher was loved by her students and respected by fellow faculty. She was active in her community and a member of The Red Hat Society. She will always be remembered for her love of her past dogs Fluffy, Norman, Charlie, and Jack. They were always at her side.

Surviving Lucy are her niece, Allison Urban and nephew, Christopher Urban. She was preceded in death by her brother, Paul Urban.

Bob and Lucy hosted a pair of annual family reunions at their beautiful Anchor Bay lake property starting in 1976 until 2018, before high water temporarily swamped the property in 2019. Lucy continued to host both family reunions after Bob's passing in 2011.

Bob and Lucy visited the Lucy's Cleveland family every year at Christmas time.

In addition to the family activities, Lucy's hobbies and interests over the years included shooting pool, pinochle, euchre, beading, boat rides and water aerobics.
