December 13, 1934 - January 23, 2025

Max Weston, age 90 of Burtchville Township, passed away on January 23, 2025 at McLaren Port Huron Hospital, after a short illness, with his family by his side. He was born on December 13, 1934 in Melvin, Michigan to the late Louis and Lydia Weston.

Max graduated from Marysville High School in 1953. He married his high school sweetheart Margaret "Muggs" Johnston on June 5, 1954 in Port Huron. They have been married 70 years. He retired from Mueller Brass, after 45 years of service. He was Past Master of Marysville Eleven Masonic Lodge #498 F. & A.M.

He was preceded in death by his nine brothers and 2 sisters.

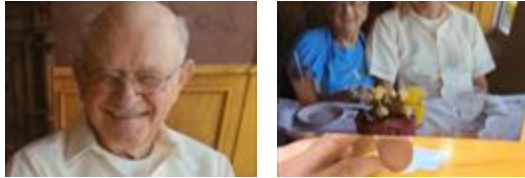
