Patricia A. Brazeel, age 86, of Shelby Township, passed away peacefully on May 5, 2024.

Patricia was an avid country music fan. Elvis Presley was her favorite entertainer. A visit to Graceland in 1982 inspired her to relocate to Memphis, Tennessee as a 50th birthday present to herself. She was active in the Elvis fan club and enjoyed Memphis and attending live music events. She made many lifelong friends, one of which being Jim Busby aka "Mr. Memphis". They enjoyed a decades long friendship, until he passed away in August of 2020.

She is survived by her daughter, Norma and 6 nieces and nephews; Larry, Debbie, Sandi, Randy, Robin and Sherrie.

She was preceded in death by her ex-husband, Elton, and 2 sons; Michael and Tony.
