



## Mr. Paul Douglas Pack

February 26, 1947 - August 25, 2012

Paul Douglas Pack, age 65, of Capac, passed away on Saturday, August 25, 2012, after a 23 year battle with Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma, due to exposure to Agent Orange during combat in Vietnam. He was born on February 26, 1947 in Washington, D.C.

He is survived by his wife of 32 years, Barb, two children; James of Port Huron and Elfrieda of Capac, one sister; Vicky of Fort Gratiot, along with many other relatives and friends.

He graduated from Marine City High School in 1967 and served in the US Marine Corps for four years, with a 13 month tour in Vietnam. After many years of struggle with the government, he was qualified as 100% service connected disabled. As with many veterans, government denial and bureaucracy regarding the dangers of Agent Orange caused years of delay in receiving entitled benefits.
