“ I 'met' Ronnie in a bit of an odd way- I'm from the UK and yet, despite never visiting Port-Huron and a distance of over 3500 miles, he still made a significant impression on me and my life, and was someone I looked to and thought of extremely fondly.

As a good friend of his daughter Rae (Celena) from the young age of 12, I 'met' him, initially, in the form of random photos and messages from Rae about or including him, and Rae would pass along messages from me to him and vice versa- just silly greetings and well wishes now and then that would always be responded to with such great enthusiasm and kindness. Later, he'd appear in the back of calls and we'd chat and have a bit of a laugh now and then, he was always such a positive, warm and friendly presence even in the little interactions we had over such a great distance.

One of my fondest memories is from when I was quite young, I mentioned to him and Rae whilst he was cooking that I'd always wanted to try Mexican food but had never had a chance to because it's not a common thing over here in the UK (or at least, especially wasn't common at the time), and he so excitedly told me I should come over to visit Rae some day so we could hang out together, so they could take me all around the city and so that he could cook me all his favourite foods, family foods and whatever else I wanted to try. I remembered that so fondly all my life, that kindness, offering someone from the other side of the world to come and share a meal, to share food, culture and conversation. I had always hoped I'd have a chance to come and do that one day, I had always planned to, but I'm sad to say I didn't make it in time.

Lots of love to you Ronnie, I'm not someone who believes in the afterlife, but man, if there is one I know for a fact you're a VIP up in heaven. Even through our little interactions I could tell you were one of the kindest, most generous and genuine men I've ever had the pleasure of meeting.

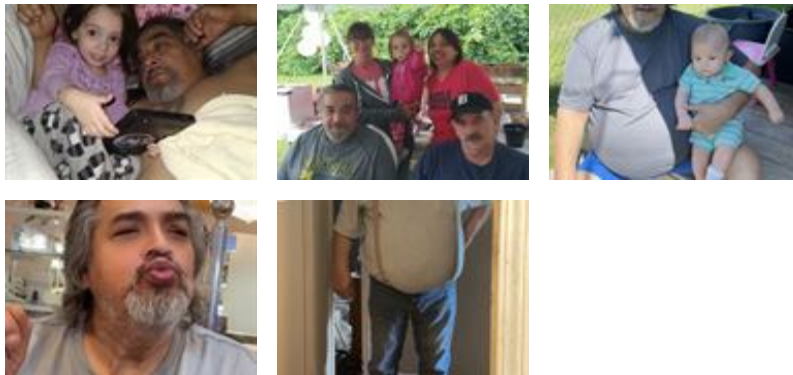
My heart entirely goes out to the rest of the family, this is such a
