“ *I met Roberta in the late 1950's at Cass Technical High School. I was 16 at the time and the Student Manager of the Boy's Varsity Basketball Team coached by Mr. Will Robinson. I spent more time in the Gym than in classes. Roberta was beginning her teaching career in the Athletic Department. She was the Varsity and Reserve Basketball Coach. Somehow we became friends.
