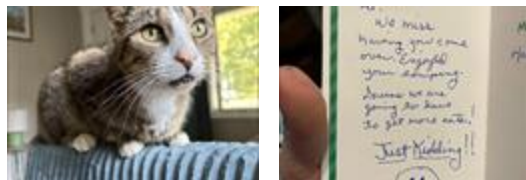
10:00 to 11:00 a.m. A luncheon will follow.

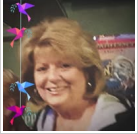
