Some of your stories involved people I never met in person, but I sure felt like I knew them after hearing them come up time and again in your stories!

*Some of my favorite memories are from when you and Grandma would watch me and Erin when we were little. I loved sleeping over and I loved getting to go camping with you in the summer (only after I was potty trained, of course)! I remember you always had a small pair of cowboy boots, a small cowboy pistol, or a small cowboy hat hanging from the rear view mirror in your truck. I remember watching *The Lone Ranger* with you. I remember when we were camping and you would go out into the water and somehow come back with handfuls of shells for Erin and I. I remember watching *Wheel of Fortune* and *Jeopardy* with you and Grandma (and I remember your affinity for *Vanna White* and the poster you had). I remember all of the fantastic projects around your house (side tables, the lamp made out of deer hooves, the playhouse in the backyard, the beer keg mailbox, and the step stools). I'm extremely grateful to have the brand new step stools you built for Griffin, Thea, and Harrison!*

I have so many great memories of the time spent with you. Two of my favorite memories are really stories that were told to me after the fact - I was too little to actually remember them on my own. When I was little, I used to follow you around and "help" you a lot when you would do things out in the garage. I was told that one time after Erin and I had been visiting, you went to mow your lawn, and I had taken your mower key home with me without you knowing! You looked everywhere for the key and couldn't find it, but I knew right where I

had placed it though. Another good story is you inadvertently teaching me to swear. I would “help” you in the garage and copy you whenever you would swear when things didn’t go exactly as planned. Grandma had to talk to you about it, but I still snuck out to “help” you and caught you when you thought I wasn’t around! To this day, my go to swear word when I’m frustrated is the same as yours always was.

The main thing I am going to remember and miss, is how solid a person you were. You were dependable, hard working, and loyal. You were a “classic” good guy through and through. You were quiet about your feelings a lot of the time, but you were incredibly loving, caring, and sensitive. You are one of the most solid and dependable people I will ever meet. I’m proud to have you as my Grandpa and I am going to miss you very much. I love you Grandpa!
